FIRE CHIEF'S ANNUAL REPORT

The Winkler Fire Department (WFD) responded to 220 emergency calls in 2022, an overall increase of 27% from the previous year. The City of Winkler had 154 emergency calls (31% increase from the previous year). The RM of Stanley had 61 emergency calls (18% increase from the previous year). There were 5 Mutual Aid calls in 2022 (1 more than in 2021). The two main areas of increased calls types from the previous year were MVAs & False Alarms.

Note: Even with the increase of calls, the actual call hours were significantly less than the previous year, which means we had fewer long incidents.

The summary of emergency calls that Winkler Fire Department responded to in 2022 for all of our areas of response were as follows. The increase or decrease from 2021 are shown in brackets.

Winkler Fire Department has 34 total staff as of December 31st. Operational positions include:

- 1 Fire Chief (full-time)
- 2 Deputy Fire Chiefs
- 8 Fire Officers
- 18 Firefighters
- 4 Communications/Logistics
- 1 Administrative Assistant (half-time)

Custodial staff person (quarter-time)


Note: Not included are 8 new recruits that are now in training.


RESPONSE TIMES


The average response time in 2022 to establish incident command from the time of 911 dispatch was 4 minutes and 19 seconds within the City of Winkler and 7 minutes and 07 seconds within the Rural Municipality of Stanley

NFPA 1720 sets a minimum response time standard for paid-on-call departments of 9 minutes for urban and 14 minutes for rural areas.



- ⇒ There were no outstanding causes of residential fire incidents in 2022
- ⇒ There were no outstanding causes of commercial occupancy fires incidents in 2022
- ⇒ Many of the 2022 false alarms were due to newly constructed buildings coming on-line with their fire detection & sprinkler systems.

Winkler Fire Department resumed fire inspections in 2022 as required by the Manitoba Fire Safety Inspection Regulation. The Manitoba Fire Safety Regulation defines those occupancies which are required to be inspected by local authorities.

Public Education was resumed in 2022. This included fire safety presentations at the firehall, PSAs on social media and in local publications in partnership with other Mutual Aid fire departments, and of course with our annual Fire Prevention Week Open House

TRAINING 2022

Fire departments have become expected to be all-hazard responders. It is challenging to keep skill sets current on all these response types.

The goal is to make realistic but safe training experiences so our responders will be well prepared!
